SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT Day Care Council – Local 205 Welfare Fund

This is a summary of the annual report of the Day Care Council - Local 205, D. C. 1707 Welfare Fund, EIN 13-2672380, Plan No. 501, health plan, for period July 01, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Board of Trustees of Day Care Council - Local 205, D.C. 1707 Welfare Fund has committed itself to pay certain claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has contracts with EmblemHealth HIP of Greater New York, EmblemHealth Group Health, Inc., and Metroplus Health Plan to pay health, dental, prescription drug and HMO claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending June 30, 2020 were \$12,504,320.

Because they are so called “experience-rated” contracts, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending June 30, 2020, the premiums paid under such “experience- rated” contracts were \$189,211 and the total of all benefit claims paid under these contracts during the plan year was \$106,091.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$26,131,790 as of June 30, 2020, compared to \$25,579,247 as of July 01, 2019. During the plan year the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$552,543. This increase includes unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan’s assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$13,773,092, including employer contributions of \$10,757,038, employee contributions of \$1,056,218, earnings from investments of \$1,637,920, and other income of \$321,916.

Plan expenses were \$13,220,549. These expenses included \$1,266,387 in administrative expenses, and \$11,954,162 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.
